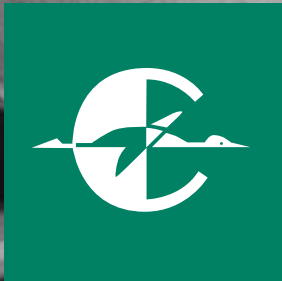

Letter from the Foundation Board



As Clearwater Camp enters its 75th year anniversary of celebrations, our beloved camp along Tomahawk Lake is entering an important and exciting new phase of its history. In the next year — with your continued devotion, involvement and outpouring of support — Clearwater Camp will become one of the premier non-profit camps in the country. Already, the generosity of the Clearwater Camp community has been inspirational. What our voyageur circle has achieved for the mission of preserving this cherished haven for future generations of girls and young women is testament to the core values of fellowship, tradition and stewardship that Clearwater's camping experience instills.



Just what has some of this fellowship along the trail looked like? One counselor sent in \$10 every month for a year. Our first donation over the Foundation Web site came in at \$1,000. Another pioneering donor has provided us with a half-million dollar donation that laid the foundation for our efforts going forward. Dozens of other alumnae and supporters have volunteered hundreds of hours of their personal time.

Every single donation and every single hour of volunteer time matters in this effort. We are pleased to note the results of some of those efforts in this first-ever annual progress report for the Clearwater Camp Foundation's donors and supporters. This inaugural report, it should be noted, illustrates the donations of the Foundation's first four years. As of December 31, 2006, approximately 200 donations have helped us raise \$1.1 million in cash and another \$1.2 million in pledges. Almost 20 percent of that total was raised during the last three months of 2006. Such a quickening pace shows us what's possible as our Foundation efforts continue to mature and expand.



During this coming year, there is much more we need to do. Ultimately our goal is to raise \$7.5 million for purchasing the camp, creating an endowment fund and establishing scholarships. By next fall our goal is to raise \$2.5 million in cash and \$3 million in pledges to make the historic purchase of Clearwater Camp. With your continued support, Clearwater Camp has a bright future that will draw from the strengths of its proud history, a love for new adventures and the will to make great things happen.

We hope that all of our alumnae, camp families, supporters and neighbors feel a sense of ownership and pride in the historic transition taking place at Clearwater Camp. Without you and your loved ones — the smiles and laughter, the memories and call to adventure, the confidence and caring throughout the years — Clearwater Camp would not be poised for this successful transition.

On behalf of the entire Foundation board of directors, our alumnae and the future generations of so many more young women who stand to benefit from personally enriching experiences along Tomahawk's shores, please accept our heartfelt thanks for all that you have done and what you continue to do for Clearwater Camp. 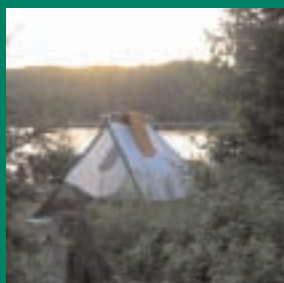
