2023 Packing List



Camp is a place where living is simple, so do not over pack. While we hope for sunny skies, it can also be cool and damp, so pack clothing that can be layered. Camp is also a place where we spend a lot of time out in nature and our activities can be quite messy, we suggest leaving your best or favorite clothing at home.

All clothing, equipment, and camper belongings must be labeled. At a minimum, please include camper's first name and the first letter of their last name, as many have the same first name. Clearwater Camp is not responsible for lost or damaged items.

SETTLING INTO A CABIN: Most of the camper's clothing will be kept in dresser drawers, with seldom-used items stored in the duffle under the bunks. Cabins do not have space for large camp trunks.

LAUNDRY SERVICE: Laundry goes out once a week and returns the next day.

Send this list with your camper, so they can check off items when packing for home.

Do not pack prescription medications. See Medication section of the Handbook for details.

All clothing, equipment, and camper belongings must be labeled.

- Use the camper's first name and last name initial (there can be multiple campers with the same first name).
- A good place to label is along the back of the clothing, such as the rear tag or seam.
- Label using either a permanent/laundry marker or iron-on labels (available at Clothing Labels by Sterling or Everything Summer Camp)
